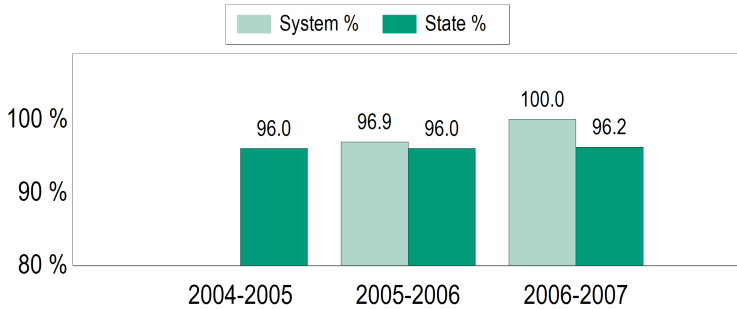

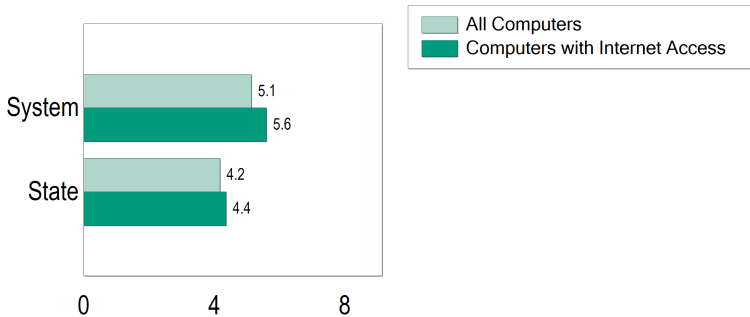
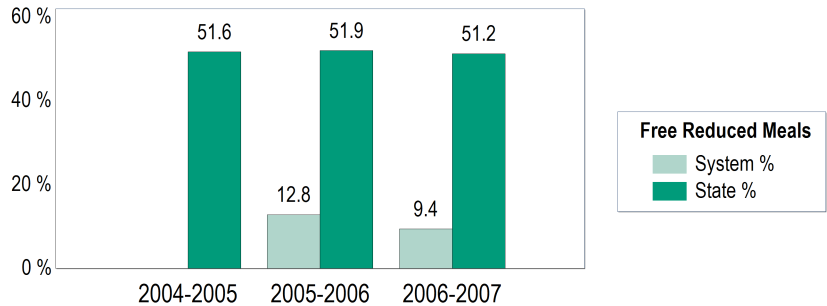


## Average Daily Attendance

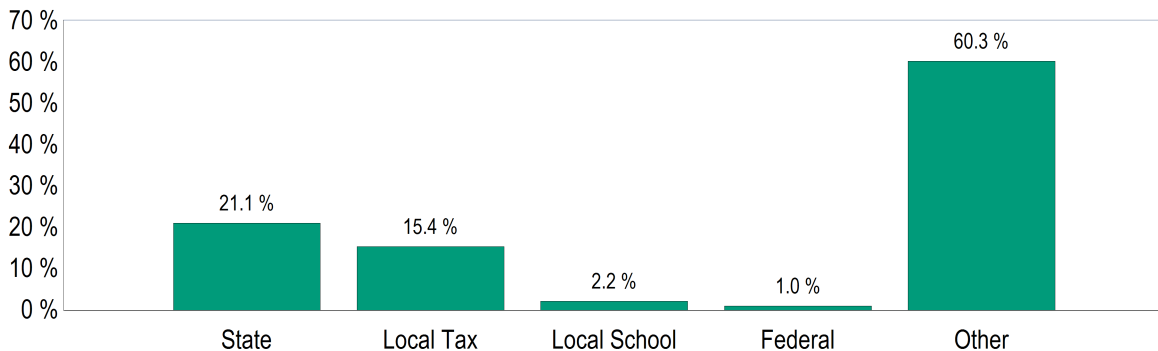

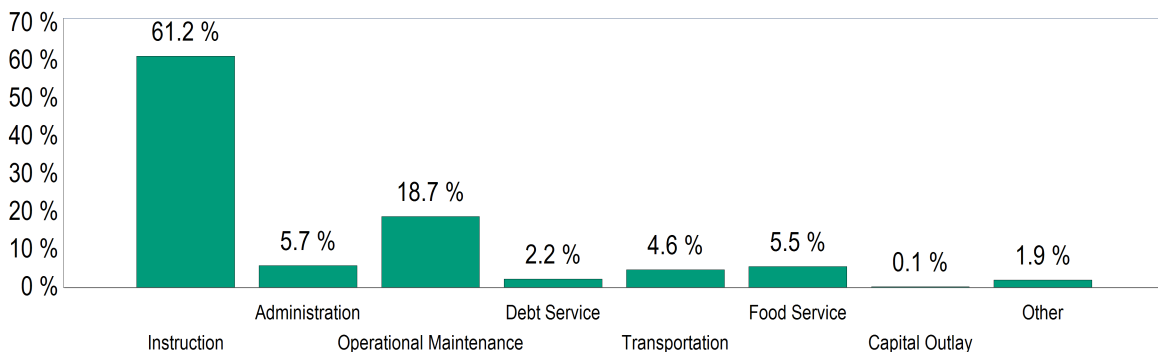
